GROUP THEORY IN MODERN MATHEMATICAL PHYSICS

RIEMANNIAN GEOMETRY AND CURVATURE

RIEMANNIAN GEOMETRY INTRODUCES METRICS TO MANIFOLDS, ALLOWING MEASUREMENT OF DISTANCES AND ANGLES. CURVATURE
